Judi Lund Person, BA, MPH, CHC serves as the Senior Advisor to the National Hospice and Palliative Care Organization for hospice payment policy, Part D, survey and certification, contractor management, and program integrity functions. She has been involved in the implementation of the HOSPICE Act with CMS, including surveyor training, enforcement remedies, and the hospice special focus program. She also represents hospice and palliative care with the Medicare Administrative Contractors (MACs) addressing confusion about attending physicians and hospice payment policy issues. She was a member of the advocacy group that lobbied for the passage of the Medicare Hospice Benefit in Congress, prepared recommendations for the original conditions of participation, and participated in the Negotiated Rulemaking for the hospice wage index.

Judi graduated with honors from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro with a degree in Sociology and has a Masters in Public Health from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. She holds a Certification in Healthcare Compliance.



Peter M. Benjamin is a Partner with The Huntington Consulting Group in Miami, FL. Benjamin began his career with American Hospital Supply Corporation (AHSC). After positions as a sales representative, product manager, market manager and regional manager he became the Director of Marketing for AHSC's home care business, Abbey Medical. This project also incorporates a technology pilot to store advanced directives and gives access to an E-POST accessible for registered users and a public facing website (www.mylifemychoices.org).

In addition to her work in SC, Marisette also serves as the VP for Community Action & Policy with CTAC and is a Community Co-investigator for the Equal ACP & Equal Space African American Faith Advance Care Planning Research projects led by Dr. Kimberly Johnson and funded by the PCORI Foundation.

Marisette is married to Bernard Hasan and they have two children, Bernard II and Sarah. She is an ordained elder engaged in her church and the community in mentoring women to advance and be fruitful in every arena of life.
