Earlier in her career, she spent 22 years as President and CEO of The Carolinas Center for Hospice and End of Life Care and was among the early advocates whose efforts helped secure the inclusion of hospice in Medicare. In recognition of her lifelong contributions to the field, she received NPHI’s inaugural Lifetime in Excellence Award in 2024.

As Senior Policy Director for NPHI, **Ethan McChesney** leads policy and regulatory initiatives, supports government and industry engagement, develops strategic resources, and helps advance the organization’s priorities. He also provides policy and project management oversight for the NPHI Innovation Lab. Prior to joining NPHI and Healthspieren, Ethan held healthcare policy roles with the National Coalition on Health Care, Wynne Health Group, and the office of U.S. Senator Michael Bennet of Colorado. In 2023, he was recognized by Hospice News as a Future Leader. Ethan earned a B.S. in Political Science from the University of Kansas, with minors in Sociology and Psychology.

Dr. **Cordt Kassner** is a nationally recognized hospice and end-of-life healthcare analyst and the founder of Hospice Analytics. He also serves as Publisher of Hospice & Palliative Care Today, Vice President of Data Science & Research at 1520ai, and holds leadership and advisory roles with several hospice and palliative care organizations.

With more than 30 years of experience spanning clinical care, research, ethics, and healthcare leadership, Cordt is widely respected for helping administrators, clinicians, policymakers, and researchers translate complex data into meaningful action to improve care. He has served on three Medicare Hospice Quality Technical Expert Panels and has taught at the University of Colorado since 1992 and Duke University since 2012.

Cordt holds degrees from Illinois State University, Denver Conservative Baptist Seminary, and the University of Colorado Denver, and recently completed Harvard Business School's online AI in Business program.

Leonard "Lenny" Jensen, MSN, FNP-C, is a healthcare leader and entrepreneur with more than 24 years dedicated to transforming end-of-life care through technology and compassionate service. He spent 16 years in the U.S. Army, ending his service as a Captain in the Army Nurse Corps, where he developed deep clinical expertise and leadership experience. In 2006 he co-founded Serenity Hospice with his wife, Marianne, followed by Keystone Health and Keystone Hospice in 2013. Frustrated by EMR inefficiencies that drove nurse burnout, he, along with his partners, launched the beta version of FireNote in February 2020, cutting new-admission charting from up to four hours to 45 minutes and earned nationwide adoption. He holds an MSN from the University of Alabama at Birmingham and is a Certified Family Nurse Practitioner specializing in palliative care and geriatric medicine.

Troy Darmody is a technologist and product leader with more than 20 years building software, and the Co-Founder and Chief Product Officer of FireNote. His career spans the earliest days of mobile innovation—he helped design some of the first WAP phone applications in 1999—and he is a named inventor on two software utility patents. At FireNote, Troy leads product vision and engineering, translating the real-world frustrations of hospice clinicians into an EMR built for how care is actually delivered. His focus on intuitive, purpose-built design has helped dramatically reduce the documentation burden for clinical teams and grown FireNote into a platform adopted by hospice and palliative care programs nationwide.
